Data Upload (December 2014)

Data from **Scotland's 2011 Census** is now available on the KnowFife Dataset. This includes **124 new indicators** across the main Census themes, all of which are listed on the following pages. Below outlines how the data can be accessed, viewed or extracted from the KnowFife Dataset at every geographical level.

This upload provides some of the key indicators under the various topics only and at this stage provides no detailed or cross tabulated indicators.

The KnowFife Dataset offers a number of benefits to users, not least the **range and flexibility of sub-Fife geographical boundaries** that are unique to the KnowFife Dataset. Along with 2001 Datazones, Wards, Fife etc, data can be viewed at Area Committee, Fife's SIMD12 quintiles and School catchment areas, which are **not available from national datasets**.

Accessing 2011 Census Data on KnowFife Dataset

Quick Profile: The '2011 Census Profile' presents snapshot of all the current Census Data. The data can be viewed for one area at a time alongside Fife and Scotland comparison figures. (An *Area Profile* can be used to view more than one area at a time.) 2011 Census data also appears in profiles under different themes (e.g. Education or Health and Wellbeing). Data picker: Allows users to pick their own selection of data for several areas within Fife's geographical boundaries. 2011 Census indicators along with data from the other Data Themes and topics within the KnowFife Dataset can be 'picked'. Thematic Maps: 2011 Census data is presented on an interactive map, available to view at all Fife geographies. This tool offers a visual representation of Census data within Fife.
