

ScotPHO Deprivation Profiles

New Deprivation Profiles for local authority and health board areas have been published by the Scottish Public Health Observatory (ScotPHO). The profiles are intended to provide service providers, planners and policy makers with nationally comparable information to improve understanding of health issues relating to these people of Scotland, to set these issues in a national context, and to take action to improve the health of communities.

The profiles are based on local quintiles (from 20% most deprived (Quintile 1) to 20% least deprived (Quintile 5)). Spine charts compare each local quintile to Scotland, highlighting where an area is significantly 'worse' or 'better' than the national average. Key measures of inequality are calculated for each of the indicators used in the profiles i) the Slope Index of Inequality, which looks at the difference between quintiles and ii) the Relative Index of Inequality, that considers variation within and between quintiles.

Fife Findings

Key findings for Fife include:

- The most deprived areas of Fife (quintiles 1 and 2) are significantly worse than the Scotland average, across all indicators (except road traffic casualties)
- The least deprived areas of Fife (quintiles 3, 4 and 5) are significantly better than the national average across a range of indicators (including income and employment deprivation, child poverty, working age benefit claimants, and crime rate)
- Fife is significantly better than Scotland on measures of inequality relating to female life expectancy, multiple emergency hospital admissions and emergency hospitalisations
- Fife is not significantly worse than Scotland on any of the key measures of inequality based on each of the indicators used in the deprivation profile, and in many cases is not significantly different from Scotland.

These results are unsurprising given that Fife has a similar socio-demographic make-up and profile to Scotland as a whole.
